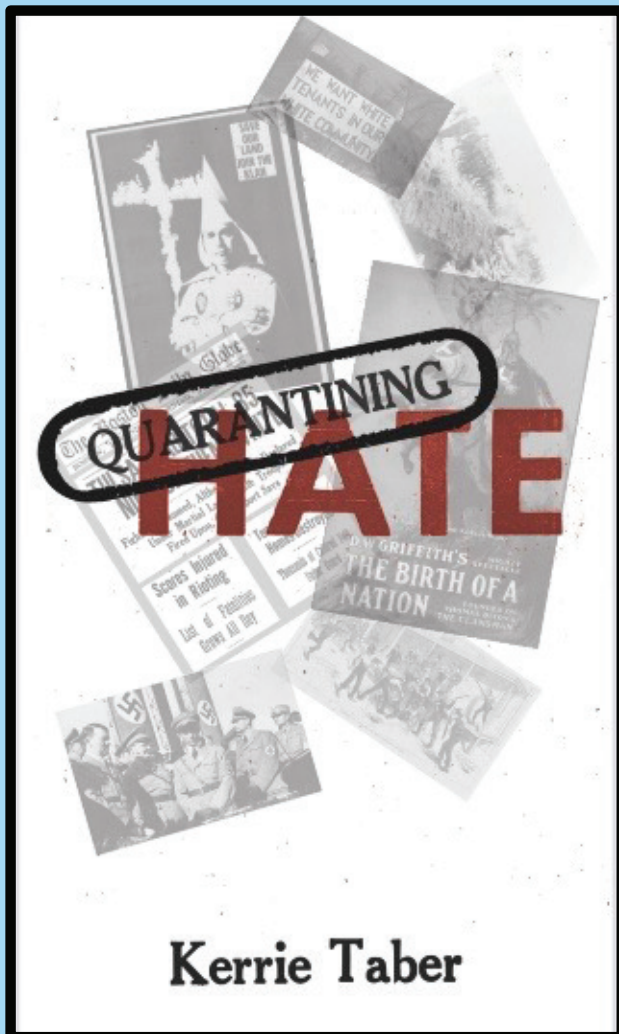


Kerrie Taber
